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Back Story

- Relation between university and 'surrounding society' (?industry)
- 1980s 'pure' versus 'applied' anthropology
 - Pure = untainted by real life
 - Applied = polluted with practical action and politics
- 1984: 100 unemployed PhD anthropologists in UK
 - add some work skills at end of PhD
 - work in policy and practice - 'no longer' anthropologists

Anthropology in Action

- Aim: feedback loop
 - not just one-directional flow - using anthropology to address problems in policy and practice (now university: industry)
 - Interaction with practitioners to generate anthropological problems that need research and theoretical elaboration, e.g. new forms of organisation and governance
 - Language, symbols, power – core disciplinary concerns
- Method
 - Network of 300 anthropologists working in development, health, education, business, media, local government
 - Vocational practice – week-long residential course – experiential learning
 - Simulated case studies of actual projects
 - Practitioner acts as facilitator
 - Team work (multi-disciplinary)
 - Working to a brief, time constraints, organisational analysis, budgeting,
 - Write proposals and reports, present them to senior managers
 - Explain anthropological approaches and insights to non anthropologists
- Mainstream in departments? Ended by RAE and QAA

UNIKE – Universities in the Knowledge Economy

Marie Skłodowska-Curie ITN Project, 2013-17

Research Question:

How are processes of creating regional and global knowledge economies redefining the nature and scope of universities in Europe and the Asia-Pacific Rim?

First aim:

A networked group of expertly trained, mobile and independent researchers taking new, critical and inter-disciplinary approaches to universities in global knowledge economies in Europe and the Asia-Pacific Rim.

Second aim:

To create a cohort of reflexive research leaders committed and able to develop doctoral education in their own institutions and internationally.

Project Composition

- 6 European Partners
- 12 PhD and 2 Post Doc Fellows – from 14 different countries
- 19 Associated Partners – hosting secondments and research visits, contributing to training

Supervision and Training

Institutional Training courses (each partner has different ECTS requirements)

- Own institution's PhD training
- Partners' PhD Training Courses available to UNIKE Fellows (on a specific topic or in English)

Fellow-led Work Groups

- Prepare for Training workshops
- Writing and editing support groups

UNIKE Workshops and Summer Schools

Research, Training and Career Plan

- Template, 6 month deadline, annual update

Supervisor

- Supervise research project
- Integrate into institution's research milieu
- University regulations (upgrades, periodic reviews, exam procedure)
- Advocate, mediator within the university (e.g. administration of expenses claims)

Secondments

- Data collection for own research project
- Task for the organisation
- Additional skills
- Networking in a sector
- UNIKE template for secondment agreement and evaluation report

UNIKE Mentors

- Meet at each workshop
Annual review of 'Research, Training and Career Plan'
- Contacts for career development, networking, dissemination etc

Secondments

- 10 Associated partners: industrial or ‘socio-economic’ actors
- Host the fellow for 2-6 months
 - Fellow integrated into daily work
 - Fellow completes an agreed piece of work for the organisation
 - Learns organisational analysis, writing in different genres, explaining insights to non-specialists
 - Organisation enables fellow to do research on itself and facilitates access to its sector
- New research agendas and relationships

Mainstreaming in Partner Institutions

- Methods for partners to feed back into own institution
 - Doctoral training
 - Relations with ‘surrounding society’
